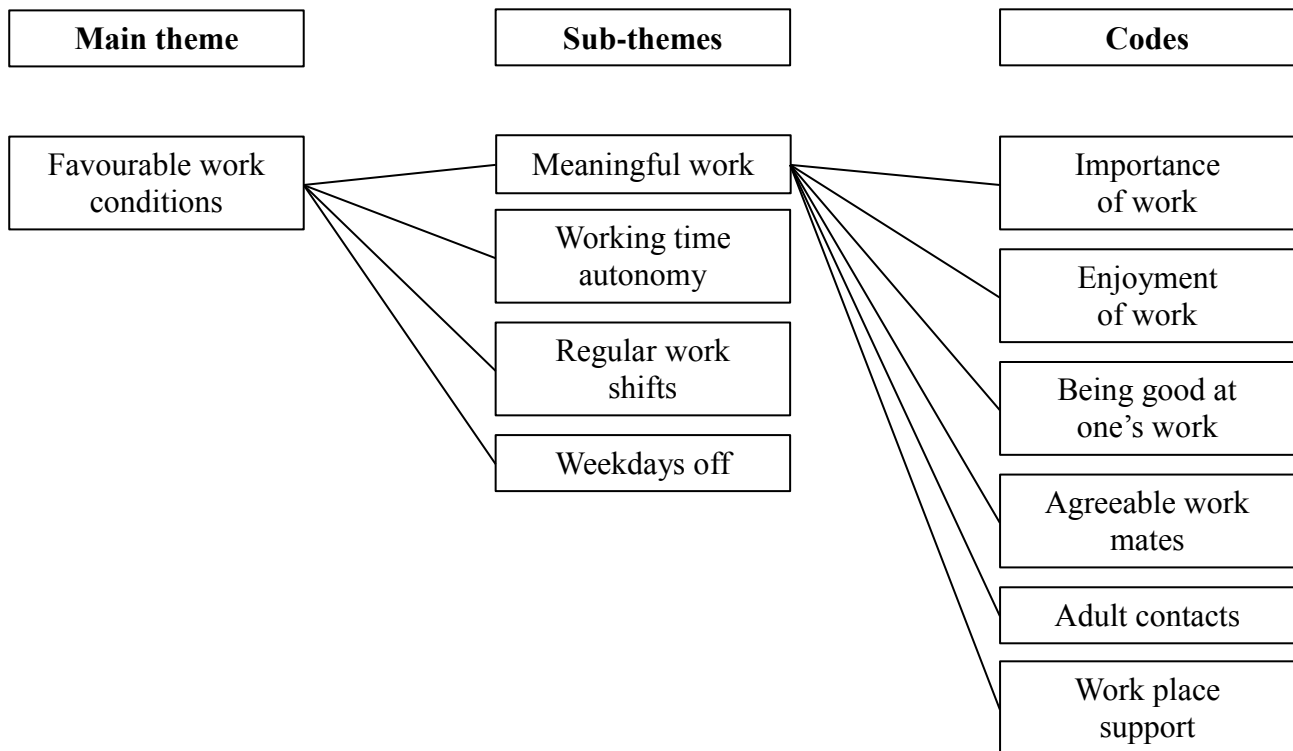


Figure 1. Example of the generation of the main theme 'favourable work conditions, its sub-themes, and the codes of the first sub-theme 'meaningful work'

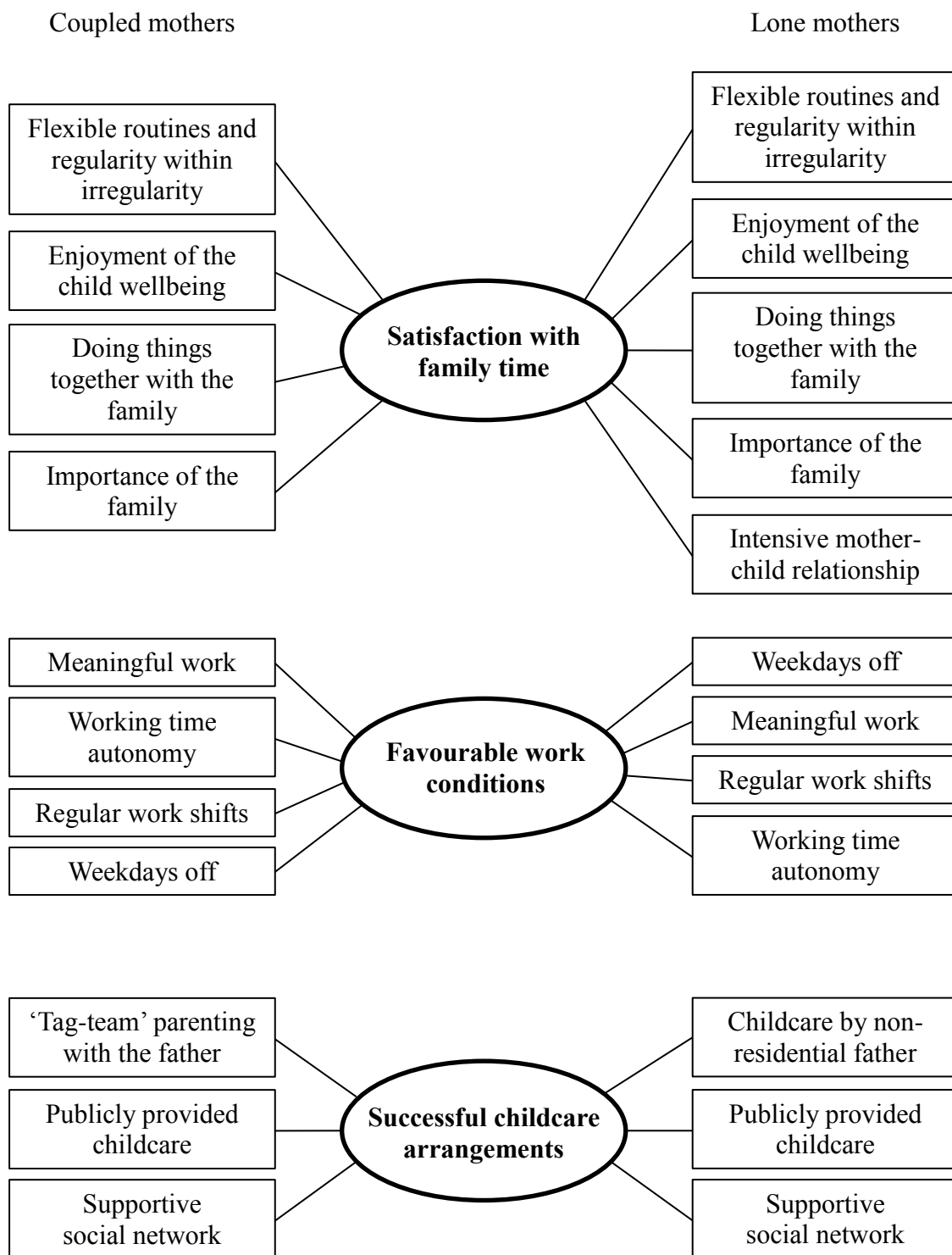

Note: The descendent order of the sub-themes is based on how the mothers prioritized them

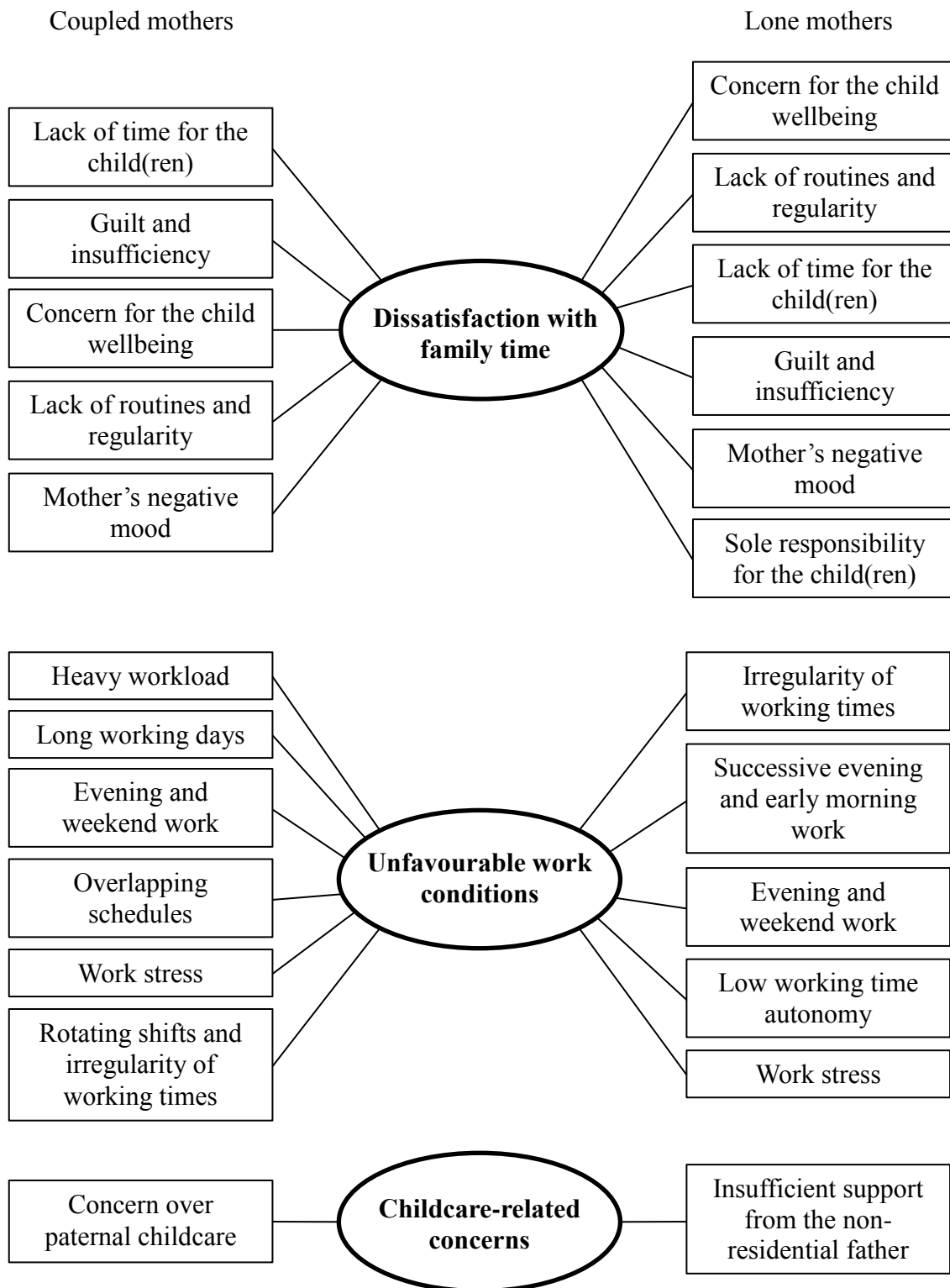
